THE BACOLOD SITUATION

The Philippines is reputed to have one of the world's longest and strictest lockdowns due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The first community quarantine and stay-at-home orders imposed by Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte began in March 2020.

As a response, Bacolod Mayor Evelio Leonardia suspended all classes in the city beginning March 20, 2020. The national government likewise imposed severe restrictions in the city.

Since then, or for the last 20 months, residents of Bacolod City and the Province of Negros Occidental have been in various stages of community quarantine classifications (semi-lockdowns) where public transportation is limited, travel is limited, movement is restricted, economic activity and social interactions are significantly reduced, stay-at-home orders for seniors and minors are still in place, etc.

From the period of June to October 2021, the city was under "General Community Quarantine with Heightened Restrictions."

Starting November 1, 2021, Bacolod City is on Alert Level 4 due to high Covid-19 cases and high hospital bed utilization rate (hospital beds and ICU beds are limited)

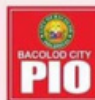

WHAT IT MEANS TO BE AT ALERT LEVEL 4



NOT ALLOWED TO OPERATE



ALERT LEVEL 4

- Face-to-face classes for higher education or for technical, vocational education and training, except those approved by the IATF and/or the Office of the President
- All contact sports, whether indoor or outdoor
- Cinemas and movie houses

ALERT LEVEL 3

Contact sports, except those conducted under a bubble-type setup as provided for under relevant guidelines adopted by the IATF, Games and Amusement Board, and Philippine Sports Commission, and approved by the LGU where such games shall be held

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NOT ALLOWED TO OPERATE



ALERT LEVEL 4 & 3

- Face to face classes for basic education
- Funfairs/ "peryas" and kid amusement industries
- Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences
- Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household.

ALERT LEVEL 4,3&2

Casinos, horse racing, cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President

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ALLOWED TO OPERATE UNDER ALERT LEVEL 4

MAXIMUM OF 10% INDOOR VENUE CAPACITY (FULLY VACCINATED INDIVIDUALS ONLY) AND 30% OUTDOOR CAPACITY :

- ✓ In person religious gatherings, with fully vaccinated religious ministers, priests, rabbis and imams
- ✓ Licensure or entrance/qualifying examinations
- ✓ Dine-in services in food preparation establishments
- ✓ Personal care establishments
- ✓ Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for non-contact exercises and sports
- ✓ Film, music and television production

NOTE: Workers/employees of these establishments are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and minimum public health standards shall be strictly maintained

ALLOWED TO OPERATE UNDER ALERT LEVEL 4

MAXIMUM OF 10% INDOOR VENUE CAPACITY (FULLY VACCINATED INDIVIDUALS ONLY) AND 30% OUTDOOR CAPACITY PROVIDED WITH SAFETY SEAL CERTIFICATION:

- ✓ Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions (MICE)
- ✓ Permitted venues for social events
- ✓ Visitor or tourist attractions
- ✓ Amusement parks and theme parks; and recreational venues

NOTE: Workers/employees of these establishments are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and minimum public health standards shall be strictly maintained



OTHER PROVISIONS

INTRAZONAL AND INTERZONAL TRAVEL

LEVEL 4

Allowed subject to the reasonable regulations of the LGU of destination, EXCEPT those below eighteen (18) years of age, belonging to the vulnerable population, those who are over sixty-five (65) years of age, those with immunodeficiencies, Comorbidities, or other health risks, and pregnant women

LEVEL 2 & 3

Allowed subject to the reasonable restrictions based on age and comorbidities, as may be determined by the LGUS, which should not be stricter as those prescribed under ALERT LEVEL 4 and subject to the oversight, monitoring, and evaluation of their respective RIATF.

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OTHER PROVISIONS

AGENCIES AND INSTRUMENTALITIES OF THE GOVERNMENT

LEVEL 4

Fully operational at least **20% on-site capacity** while applying work-from-home and other flexible work arrangements

LEVEL 3

Fully operational at least **30% on-site capacity** while applying work-from-home and other flexible work arrangements

LEVEL 2

Fully operational at least **50% on-site capacity** while applying work-from-home and other flexible work arrangements.

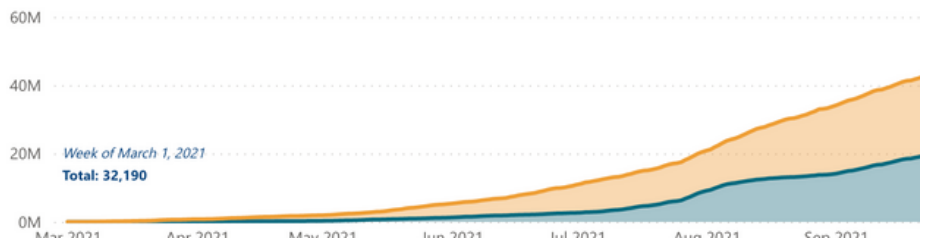
Average daily doses in the last 7 days



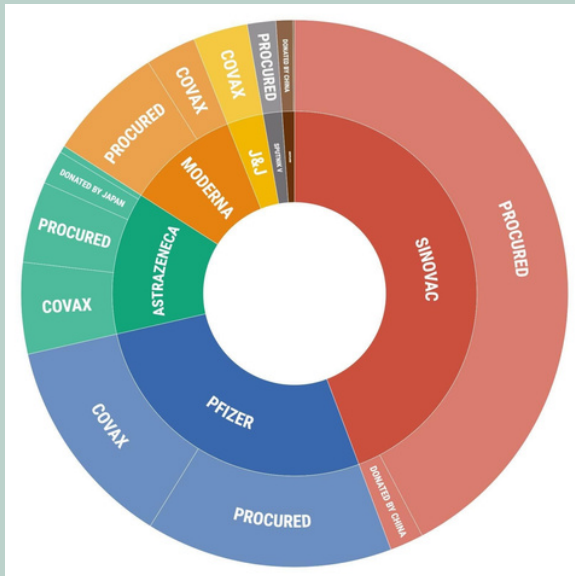

VACCINATION IN BACOLOD

The Philippines started vaccinating its citizens in March 2021.

With the initial arrival of vaccines, Bacolod City began its rollout on March 6, 2021 for the priority groups of healthcare workers, senior citizens and persons with comorbidities.

At this time, the city has opened the vaccination program to the general population.

In November 3, 2021, the rollout for pediatric vaccinations for minors aged 12 to 17 began nationwide. For the past days, there have been a good number of children getting vaccinated in Bacolod.

The Department of Health has approved administration of booster shots or 3rd shots to priority groups, but there is no word yet when this will take place in the city and province.

The city has a several venues to bring the vaccines to its citizens.

Vaccine sites include malls and barangay (village) centers. Mobile vaccination in buses are brought to public markets and downtown areas. The city brings jabs to the offices and warehouses, and even house-to-house. There are also 24-hour vaccinations located in select venues.

Yet, vaccination rate in the city is still low at about 30%. While there are enough vaccines in the country, these are mostly concentrated in the National Capital Region (Manila area). These need to be deployed by government to the provinces and other regions.

More effort at curbing vaccine hesitancy has to be done in order to safely reopen schools and more importantly, the economy.
